



## Raising Dementia Awareness Amongst Primary School Children

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- Dementia is an umbrella term for over 100 disorders that affect the brain, such as Alzheimer's disease.
- Dementia affects the way people think and behave and can interfere with their normal life.
- By 2050, approximately 900,000 Australians are expected to be living with dementia.
- Children today, more than ever before, are likely to know family and/or community member living with a form of dementia.





#### Project DARE (Dementia knowledge, Art, Research & Education)



- Multidisciplinary team of teachers, artists and researchers with the aim to increase awareness of dementia amongst Stage 2 children (ages 8-11 years).
- The intervention was piloted in May 2017 in three stages.
  Stage 1: The children created their first artwork
  Stage 2: The dementia lesson will take place.
  Stage 3: The children were able to add to/modify their artwork.





#### **Research Measures**



Mixed-methods approach Pre-post test design Artwork Survey tool, Kids4Dementia Interviews with children

Aim to measure changes in children's knowledge and perception of dementia.











## Lesson 1 Art intervention





Artspace is part of Big Fat Smile a not for profit NGO.

They employ degree-qualified, professional artists to work with children aged 3-13 years.

The artists must be exhibiting 'career' artists (working on their own practice). Influenced by the Reggio Emilia approach, the artists work alongside children and educators in support of their creative (learning) process.

# Results & Exhibitions



#### Survey Results – Preliminary Analysis

- Pre and post matched data n=74
- Slightly more boys (41; 55.4%); most born in Australia (66; 89.2%)
- Majority aged 8yrs (26; 35%) or 9yrs (36; 49%)
- T-tests showed significant improvement (p<.05) for the following variables:</li>
  - Spending time with people with dementia can be fun
  - People with dementia can feel when others show them love and understanding
  - People with dementia have hobbies and interests
  - People with dementia can be creepy
  - You can "catch" dementia from other people
  - Dementia is when something has gone wrong in your brain
  - Dementia is unpredictable
- Only one variable got worse, 'I wouldn't really know what to say or do if I met someone with dementia'.
